The music of the Dong people has been documented in recordings and video footage by the Western China Cultural Ecology Research Workshop (http://workshop. ffmm.com), a Hong Kong-based, non-government, non-profit organization dedicated to cultural preservation and socioeconomic development in the region.

Its initial recording, *Dong Folk Songs: People and Nature in Harmony*, was honored in China's 2003 Ministry of Culture Media Awards and has been broadcast both in Europe and North America. More recently, the Workshop has garnered *Travel & Leisure* magazine's 2008 Global Vision Award for Cultural Preservation and was a featured subject in the May 2008 issue of *National Geographic* magazine.
